Together this year, we raised \$1.05 million to benefit Hoag Family Cancer Institute, bringing our total to \$18 million since Sandy and her circle of friends gathered together after her hard-won battle with breast cancer. Thanks to her and those founding members' inspirational leadership, Hoag Family Cancer Institute has become the largest cancer program in Southern California, outside of LA County, and is the leading provider of radiation therapy and cancer care in Orange County.



Circle 1000 helped Hoag Family Cancer Institute step into a new era of cancer treatment while continuing to support the patient journey and advance education for nurses and non-nursing staff. Here are a few highlights of the impact of your generosity in the fiscal year 2017.

\$500,000: Precision Medicine Program


Burton Eisenberg, MD, Grace E. Hoag Executive Medical Director Endowed Chair, and Michael Demeure, MD, program director for Precision Medicine at Hoag, laid the groundwork to coordinate a robust precision medicine program that will benefit patients with all types of cancer. Precision medicine is the practice of genomically profiling cancer tumors using next-generation sequencing. This comprehensive sequencing and analysis provide a complete picture of each patient's individual cancer, allowing physician teams to determine the most effective targeted treatments available.

\$141,000: Arden Flamson Nurse Navigator for Breast and Gynecological Cancer

\$70,000: Liver Cancer Clinic

Hoag Family Cancer Institute, in close collaboration with physician specialists, continues to work to develop a leading program to provide complex hepatobiliary cancer care. The program will give patients access to a multidisciplinary team of experts, including a highly specialized surgical team that provides expert-level care.

\$30,000: Oncology Staff Education

Circle 1000 funding allows radiation oncology therapists, technicians, physicists, dosimetrists and other non-nursing oncology staff to attend symposiums and conferences to learn the most up-to-date information in their fields of expertise.

\$50,000: Hoag's Nationally-Recognized Oncology Nursing Conference

Hoag's 12th Annual Embracing Excellence in Oncology Nursing Conference was made possible by the generosity of Circle 1000. Registered nurses who attend receive continuing education credit from the California Board of Registered Nursing.

\$50,000: Sandy Sewell Oncology Nursing Scholarship Endowment

Circle 1000 continues to help Hoag reach critical nursing education objectives to have 80 percent of nurses BSN certified by the year 2020. Currently, 73 percent of Hoag nurses hold a BSN or higher, an 12 percent increase over the last two years. This year, Hoag awarded multiple oncology nursing scholarships to nurses earning advanced degrees. Generous funding from Circle 1000 helps Hoag equip oncology nurses with the specialized skills needed to care for patients with complex health care needs.



Oncology Nurse Scholarship Recipient: Mai Uyen Do, RN, BSN


Hoag oncology nurse Mai Uyen Do was 16 years old when she arrived in the US on a Vietnam refugee boat. What she lacked in English-speaking skills she made up for in work ethic and a calling to help others. She earned her associate's degree in nursing at night while working full time. But the 20-year Hoag employee thought her longtime goal of advanced nursing education was out of reach until she learned about nursing scholarships at Hoag.

"The BSN program has made me a better leader and is helping me provide better patient care. Everything we do on the unit is about applying what we learned in school," says Mai, who has led numerous quality improvement programs since graduating. Mai will soon begin the master's in nursing program with the help of a Hoag scholarship.

"Advanced education is what I've always wanted," she says. "If it wasn't for the generosity of Circle 1000 donors, it would not have been possible. I am forever grateful."
